► What is SaaS?

Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) is a deployment method for software applications via the Internet. Rather than installing software, users simply access the application via a secure web browser, eliminating the need for complex on-premise hardware and software installation and management. SaaS applications can be extremely configurable, eliminating the need for heavy customization. The many benefits of the SaaS model include lower costs, faster implementation, access from anywhere at any time, painless upgrades, and on-demand scalability.

Lower costs and allow IT to focus on strategic tasks

With SaaS solutions you can eliminate the need to buy, build and maintain your IT infrastructure for your applications, dramatically lowering costs to your organization. Since SaaS applications are subscription based, no license fees are required. And, SaaS allows you to offload the management of IT infrastructure, lowering costs for hardware, software and the people needed to manage it all.

Faster implementation time and immediate updates

The SaaS model allows your organization a near zero-time deployment process, allowing you to get up and running quickly.
